Dear Friends,

As 2019 ends and 2020 begins, I am pleased to report that Congress made progress on a number of issues important to Maine families despite the polarization in our country.

In a major win for surviving military and retiree spouses to whom we are deeply indebted, I was proud to co-lead the repeal of what is often referred to as the "Military Widow's Tax," an unfair offset of survivor benefits that has prevented as many as 67,000 surviving spouses—including more than 260 from Maine—from receiving the full benefits they deserve.

The high cost of health care and prescription drugs continues to be a top issue for families and seniors. To provide continued relief for more lower- and middle-income individuals, I led the charge to extend for another two years the medical expense tax deduction that I included in the 2017 tax law. Without this extension, nearly 20,000 Mainers and millions of Americans with high medical expenses, including many with preexisting conditions, would have faced an increased tax burden. In other good news, the CREATES Act I cosponsored became law. It will prevent pharmaceutical companies from blocking access to a sufficient supply of brand-name drugs needed for the studies that allow less expensive alternatives to enter the marketplace.

Improving people's health and wellbeing remains my priority. On a per capita basis, Maine has the highest incidence of Lyme disease in the country. In August, I held a Senate hearing at the University of Maine's Tick Lab on this growing public health crisis. A comprehensive public health strategy to combat this epidemic is needed, and the new law I authored will do just that.

In addition, I helped champion another \$2.6 billion increase for the National Institutes of Health, our nation's premiere biomedical research institution, including significant boosts for Alzheimer's disease and diabetes research. Last year, NIH funded more than \$111 million for research at 14 Maine institutions.

To help prepare the graduates of Maine Maritime Academy, I secured \$300 million for a new training ship, which will ensure rigorous instruction for MMA students for decades to come.


Significant federal funding was approved for work at Bath Iron Works and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard. Funding appropriated by Congress will pay for three new destroyers, make a down payment on an additional ship, and finance infrastructure improvements at PNSY.

As Chairman of the Transportation and Housing Appropriations Subcommittee, I have led efforts to improve our nation's crumbling infrastructure and ensure that Maine's housing needs are addressed. For Maine's roads, bridges, airports, and seaports, tens of millions in federal funding will help make urgently needed upgrades and improve safety. Funding will also support housing assistance to low-income families and seniors and aid communities in reducing homelessness among our youth. The Community Development Block Grant program will assist numerous towns and cities in our State.

The Aging Committee I chair has continued its focus on financial security for our seniors. A new law I authored will make it easier for small businesses to offer retirement plans to their employees. Our Aging Committee's Fraud Hotline fielded more than 1,200 calls this year. Congress passed a new law to crack down on robocallers who are often the perpetrators of these scams. And a new law I authored will expand the IRS' Identity Protection PIN program nationwide to prevent identity theft tax refund fraud.

At the end of 2019, I cast my 7,262nd consecutive vote. In the New Year, I will keep working to deliver bipartisan solutions to the challenges facing Maine and the nation. Dear Friends,


The beginning of a new year provides the opportunity to reflect on the progress of the past 12 months. If you've been watching cable TV, you might think that every waking moment of 2019 in Washington has been consumed by divisive, partisan issues – and while there's no shortage of those debates, there have also been opportunities for bipartisan cooperation. You sent me to the Senate to make the most of those opportunities, so as we enter into the New Year, I wanted to take a moment to update you on my efforts to work with members of both parties to make life better for the people of Maine.

One of my most important priorities this past year has been emphasizing preventive healthcare. Maine's distinction as the oldest state in the nation brings us wisdom, of course – but it also creates unique challenges, particularly relating to healthcare. The key to addressing these obstacles is being proactive, because the cheapest, safest medical procedure is the one that doesn't need to happen. That's why I've introduced legislation to incentivize healthier living, expand mental health screenings, and help more Americans access regular check-ups. We're making progress, but we've got a long way to go – and I'd like your help, because I know that the best ideas are the ones that come from families and communities on the front lines of these challenges. To strengthen this effort, I convened a policy forum on prevention in Bangor in October, which has already given me exciting new ideas that I'll carry with me into 2020. If you have additional thoughts on encouraging preventive healthcare, please share them with my office.

This year has also continued the growth of Maine's forest products industry – a key focus of my work to revitalize Maine's rural economy and communities. We've seen significant investment in mills across the state, creating good jobs to support rural Maine. I'm also pleased that the investments aren't just in our mills – the industry is thriving because of its commitment to innovation. We're fortunate to have the University of Maine's top-notch researchers exploring cutting-edge ways to use our forest resources, including capitalizing on the rise of 3D printing technology with the world's largest 3D printer. Combining this work with ongoing federal support, our vast forests, and Maine's dedicated workforce, I know that the future of this industry is bright, and I'll continue working to support it on all fronts.

I'm proud of all we've accomplished together this year, but even as I reflect on all that we've achieved, it is challenging to not think of the work left undone. It sometimes can be discouraging to watch these important priorities hang in limbo, but fortunately for me, encouragement is never far. After all, I get to live in Maine – which means I get to count Maine people as my neighbors and friends. I'm always struck by the kindness that our citizens show not only to me, but also to each other. This focus on collaboration and compassion is an inspiration, and it powers my efforts bring a little bit of Maine common sense to Washington. Thank you for all you do to for our state – Mary and I are deeply grateful, and we hope that 2020 will be a good year for you, your family, your community, and the State of Maine.

Dear Friends and Residents of Sorrento,

It has been an honor to serve as your state senator this term. I first ran for office to advocate for policies that improve the lives of people across Hancock County. Even though our most recent session was unexpectedly cut short by the pandemic, I want to share with you some of what my colleagues and I were able to accomplish in the legislature.

This year, we were able to grow Maine's Rainy Day Fund to \$258 million, the highest it has ever been. This pandemic and its economic consequences have highlighted the need for this fund, and the bipartisan, balanced budget we passed last year meant we entered this crisis in a strong position.

We prioritized the health of all Mainers by working to fix our broken health care system. We established protections for those with preexisting conditions and lowered prescription drug costs, including capping the out-of-pocket cost of insulin. We passed legislation that ended surprise and abusive billing practices, which have made health care costly and unpredictable for so many.

We also acted to improve access to reliable, high-speed internet. This is an issue that comes up often in my conversations with people across Hancock County. Now more than ever before, we're relying on the internet to educate our children, expand our small businesses, and to stay in touch with our loved ones, so it's important for everyone in our community to have access to this resource.

With COVID-19 impacting all of us in different ways, I'm working with many people one-on-one to find solutions to the challenges they're facing. In accordance with Title 36, M.R.S.A., Se. 706, as amended, the Assessors of the Town of Sorrento hereby give notice to all persons liable to taxation in said municipality, that they will be in session at the Town Office in said municipality on the 7<sup>th</sup> of April 2022 at 7:00PM for the purpose of revising lists of the estates taxable in said municipality.

**Owners**

All the persons liable to taxation in the Town of Sorrento, Maine and all Administrators, Executors, Trustees, etc, of all estates taxable in said municipality of such persons are hereby notified to furnish to THE ASSESSORS TRUE AND PERFECT LIST OF ALL THEIR ESTATES, REAL AND PERSONAL, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the seventh day of April, 2021 and be prepared to make oath of the truth of the same and to answer all proper inquiries as in writing as to the nature, situation and value of their liable to be taxed.

**Estates Distributed**

And when estates of persons deceased have been distributed during the past year, or have changed hands from any cause, the executor, administrator, or other persons interested, are hereby warned to give notice of such change, and in default of such notice will be held under law to pay the tax assessed although such estate have been wholly distributed and paid over.

**Persons Doomed**

And any person who neglects to comply with this notice is hereby barred to his right to make application to the ASSESSORS or any appeal therefrom, for any abatement of his taxes, unless he furnishes such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to furnish it at the time appointed.

## SORRENTO FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Sorrento Fire and Rescue department responded to 129 calls from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. Twenty-five of these calls were emergency medical services related within the town as well as mutual aid calls from surrounding towns. The one hundred and four related calls ranged from residential fires including chimney fires, electric fires, brush and grass fires, control burns, false alarms, and alarms sounding. Also included are trees down across roads and wires, utility lines down, motor vehicle accidents, water searches and rescues, missing persons, mutual aid and standby for other departments, training sessions, work sessions and meetings. There were five training opportunities that helped keep the department current and compliant. The department also had many work sessions for the year in and around the fire station or vehicles that involved countless numbers of man hours. In all, the men and women of the Sorrento Fire Department answered the call to duty 129 times for fire calls, EMS calls, training sessions, work sessions or meetings. The number of man hours spent on paperwork and phone calls are not included in this figure.

Mutual aid calls give the department an opportunity to utilize the skills that have been learned in other than a training scenario. The department's membership and mutual aid agreements with the departments of the Schoodic Region Emergency Services Association (SRESA) consisting of Aurora, Eastbrook, Franklin, Gouldsboro, Hancock, Sullivan, Winter Harbor and now Steuben, provide a way to address critical manpower shortages experienced by all volunteer organizations throughout the day and night. SRESA continues to provide a forum for regular meetings every other month to discuss upcoming mutual trainings, equipment updates, NFPA requirements, and issues involving fire/EMS training, equipment compliance, etc. at both the state and federal level.

Routine equipment and apparatus maintenance is critical to insure their operation in times of emergency. This maintenance keeps personnel familiar with the operation of the equipment and apparatus, but also serves to catch problems early enough to have less effect on their use and the budget. Periodic oil changes, lubrication, and the correction of problems that surface as the apparatus or equipment is used are all part of this maintenance. In addition, the fire station is maintained and repaired as needed.

Keeping track of the paperwork from the various governmental agencies and the insurance companies that keep the department current and compliant is part of the responsibilities of Deputy Chief Dwayne Clement. Constant updating of department records to avoid possible fines during a spot check by one of the agencies is required. Also, he tracks equipment purchases, deliveries, and payments. His efforts are behind the scenes, but are time consuming and essential.

Assistant Chief Brian Clement spends many additional hours behind the scenes making sense of and inputting data of emergency calls into the new state computer program for the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS). This fulfills department and grant requirements as well as adds to the national data base on the types of calls that fire departments nationwide experience.

The finance committee continues to maintain the delicate balance of keeping expenses in check but also keeping the department's equipment updated and in good condition. The committee is well aware of the economic realities of today and will continue to try not to significantly impact the overall town budget. Donations from town residents provide the department with additional funds that continue to supplement the annual budget. The careful management of the budget funds and the donations has given the department the opportunity to offset costs.

Grant monies are sought yearly. The grants, such as the FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant, Forestry Grants and Maine Municipal Association grants, if obtained after competition with hundreds of other applicants, provide the department with help to offset costs of mandated equipment or obtain equipment otherwise not able to be afforded. Forestry grants and Maine Municipal Association grants when received help to purchase necessary and needed firefighter protective gear.

As winter approaches, the department would like to remind everyone that access to your property as the snow piles up is essential for both the fire department and emergency medical services to be able to make a timely entry. The better the access is the better the chance should be of a good outcome if help is needed. The use of alternative heat sources brings a reminder of more awareness of home fire safety.

**Please remember that portable generators should not be run inside of your home or in a structure such as a garage or shed. The consequences can be deadly.**

We would like to thank the residents of the Sorrento community for their cooperation in practicing fire prevention and fire safety. Remember, burn permits are required and must be obtained before you burn. Please help us help you to have yet another fire safe year.

Please continue to report any sightings of fire, smells of smoke, wires down, trees on wires, or trees in the road by calling 911 immediately. Do not touch or attempt to move any wires that are down. It is much better to have us investigate and find nothing or something small before it gets out of control. Proper house numbering helps us find the scene faster at a time when seconds count in averting a tragedy. It is very important for all of us to be very observant in keeping our neighbors and town fire safe.

New members are always welcome to join the special group of men and women who are the Sorrento Fire Department! We will be glad to answer any questions you might have. There are plenty of things that must be done to keep the fire station and department running and you just might find out you would like to help us. We also encourage residents to stop in when you see us at the station. We will be glad to show you around!

We appreciate the support given to the department by the residents of the town and will continue to strive to fulfill our mission to serve and protect.

Costs to the Fire Department particularly mandated yearly equipment maintenance and inspections as well as equipment repairs and upgrades and fluctuating prices are continuing thus far to be managed by the department through a combination of the budget, grants, and the donations made by the residents. The Fire Department understands very well the economic realities faced by everyone and continues to try to have as little impact as possible on the overall Town budget and still fulfill its mission to serve and protect.**

## ROAD COMMISSIONER REPORT

The work on the Town's roads has still been ongoing during 2019-2020. More work will be done this fall, including brush and tree cutting and removal, ditching, and paving. Weather permitting, this will be completed before winter begins.

A review of the roads considered to be in the poorest condition is still under discussion with the selectmen to determine which will have to be paved sooner rather than later. This process is dependent on the cost of the hot top which continues to be locally estimated at \$120,000.00 per mile. More reasonable prices are being sought in an effort to keep down costs.

## PUBLIC SAFETY REPORT

As always, a big thank you to all the residents of the Town of Sorrento for their safety consciousness in 2019-2020. Your reporting of damaged, removed, or spray-painted street signs is the type of information necessary to repair or replace them as soon as possible. These signs are very important for emergency services personnel, especially fire, police, and medical, as well as utility companies to find the correct address.

A critical part of public safety is for residents to accurately use the 9-1-1 address that has been assigned to their property. The mailbox and/or home should clearly display your 9-1-1 address to allow quick identification. If you are having difficulty with your 9-1-1 address display, please call me for assistance.

**REMEMBER: BURN PERMITS ARE ALWAYS REQUIRED.** These can be obtained in person from the Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief, Assistant Chiefs, or Chief Engineer of the Sorrento Fire Department. No burn permits will be issued during dry conditions such as now.

Smoke and CO2 detector batteries should be replaced when the clocks are turned back one hour. **This "FALL BACK 1 HOUR" will take place on Sunday, November 1, 2020.**

Also, easy access to your property and residence should be maintained for everyone's safety. This includes the timely reporting of downed trees and power lines in your area. Power lines could be entangled and hidden in the downed trees. **NEVER TOUCH LOW HANGING OR DOWNED POWER LINES AS THEY MAY STILL BE ENERGIZED.**

As the fall and winter seasons approach, residents are urged to check over those items they feel they will need ahead of time rather than at the last minute. Please check carefully any alternative heat sources before using them.

**PLEASE REMEMBER: DO NOT RUN PORTABLE GENERATORS INSIDE OF YOUR HOUSE OR ANY OTHER STRUCTURE, INCLUDING GARAGES AND SHEDS.**

The lack of rainfall has thus far continued through the summer, resulting in the drought now being experienced as this is being written.

Forest fires have been more frequently reported throughout Hancock County. Thankfully, these have been able to be contained quickly. If you see smoke, please report it so that the fire department can be dispatched to check it out. **REMEMBER: BURN PERMITS ARE REQUIRED.**

As always in the event of a big storm, the fire department will be out checking for damage such as trees and overhead wires down, and washed out roads. Reports from the town residents regarding their neighborhoods continue to be a great help to the fire department. **Remember: DO NOT GO NEAR a downed line or one that is tangled in a downed tree. CALL 9-1-1** to have the fire department dispatched to check it out. The fire department has a special tool that will indicate if a downed line is one that is electrically charged or not.

The Incident Command System (ICS) is utilized to keep the fire and rescue department up-to-date and compliant. The time and effort to do the training and make use of the ICS by the emergency services personnel is greatly acknowledged.

Likewise, the continued cooperation of the residents of the Town of Sorrento is very much appreciated

Since half of our past fiscal year was spent under COVID-19, the Sorrento Community Building did not have as much use as it normally would.

Last September we did hold our Annual Town Election and Meeting. The building was also used for the Annual Long Pond Water District meeting, state/federal elections last November and this past March. There were meetings and classes for Sorrento Fire Department and 2 meetings of SRECA (Schoodic Regional Emergency Services Association). The building was also used to ready Christmas presents for Santa to deliver via the fire trucks.

9. To see if the Town will vote to commission art commemorating the 125<sup>th</sup> celebration of the Town incorporation in 1895 to be paid for by donations.

10. To see if the Town will vote to choose a location to place a 125 year commemorative work of art. Choices include:
- Installed location to be on the side of the town office building facing the parking lot.
  - Installed location to be on the front gable of the Sorrento Community Building.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$20,000 and appropriate from Surplus 10,000 for the Capital Improvement Fund which is dedicated to the purpose of paying for high

cost capital improvement expenditures incurred by the Town without abruptly raising taxes or obtaining loan

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000 to the Shoreline Improvement Account, "SHIP", along with any donations, to maintain, improve and repair the Town's public shoreline property.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000 for the Sorrento Community Building to cover running expenses, with any remainder to be transferred into the Community Building Committee's checkbook
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$5,000 and appropriate \$10,000 from surplus for the Fire Truck Fund. Money from this fund can only be withdrawn by voter appropriation for Fire Truck replacement.
15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept for the Town gifts or grants of money from Federal, State or private sources.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of all property held by tax liens on such terms as they deem advisable, and execute quit claim deeds for such property providing any such sale is advertised in the Ellsworth American for 30 days and the Sorrento Newsletter for at least one time prior to such sale so that all may have an opportunity to bid on same.
17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to spend an amount not to exceed ¼ of the budgeted amount in each category of the 2020-2021 fiscal year during the period July 1, 2021 until the annual town meeting for the year 2021.
18. To see if the Town will authorize the Fire Department, with the Selectmen's approval, to dispose of surplus capital equipment in a manner that best benefits the Fire Department.
19. The property tax levy limit adjusted this year for Sorrento according to State law is \$405,398. In the event that the preceding articles are approved as presented the municipal property tax levy will be less than the property tax levy limit by \$18,568.
20. To see if the Town will vote to adjourn the meeting.
